Patricia (1949): *“A few years ago, daily activities like biking, walking and climbing stairs became harder and harder. I went through many medical tests and the final diagnosis was pulmonary fibroses. This is a very serious lung disease with progressive scarring of lung tissue, which eventually affects the ability to get enough oxygen into the bloodstream. My life changed completely and I got dependent on medical oxygen and a wheelchair.*

I became a member of the society for people with pulmonary fibroses in the Netherlands. The society gives support and brings people with pulmonary fibroses together. This helps us cope and how to live with the disease. The society advocate our interests and supports research to find the cause of the disease and find targeted therapies and rehabilitations”.
